Overview	<p>The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. In addition to this money is provided to schools for service children.</p> <p>Children who have been adopted from local authority care are eligible for pupil premium plus</p> <p>The pupil premium will be calculated on the number of students who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years.</p> <p>We have also received additional funding to cater for our CLA although not from the pupil premium fund.</p>

<p>Impact of spending</p>	<p>Academic Take up of music lessons only by 2 children. Reports received from the music teacher. As a result of the new voucher system for uniform. The uniform grant was taken up by all eligible children. Each child who receives PP funding is closely monitored and their progress discussed with class teachers. See separate notes.</p>

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	<p>1-1 tutoring takes place in the summer term for all FSM and other eligible PP children. Areas of particular need are identified and support with reading writing and maths is available</p> <p>Physical All children have been able to access all school trips through the pupil premium funding. The cost of trips has increased this year due to the number of FSM in year 6 with the residential trip, cathedral leavers service and learning course.</p> <p>Emotional/Pastoral The busy bee hive runs on lunchtimes. There is a timetable for children to attend and is very popular. The busy bee nurture group runs three mornings a week. Nurture teachers and class teachers liaise about the needs of individual children. They are then given a Boxall assessment which determines whether they would benefit from a nurture curriculum. This runs for at least 10 weeks before children are reassessed and future needs determined. Parents are kept fully informed of their children's progress through consultations.</p>
